We have engaged in performance poetry about different creatures and used this to create our own versions.


In Maths, our Reception pupils of the class have been getting to grips with conceptual subitizing and part, part, wholes.

At the start of Term 3, we used ribbons (and clothing) to create extended movement sequences that reflected a battle. We pretended to be Magnus (or any Anglo-Saxon Warrior) and completed a movement sequence that included different levels, ways of travelling and leaps. 


## One final thought...
